

# WHAT IS SAGCOT?

SAGCOT stands for the Southern Agricultural Growth Corridor of Tanzania.

SAGCOT is an Initiative of the government of Tanzania to build an industrial economy through agriculture.

This initiative is a 20 year public-private partnership which aims to  $\cdot$ 

- Ensure 350,000 hectares in profitable production, serves regional and international markets.
- Ensure tens of thousands of smallholders become commercial farmers, with access to irrigation and weather insurance.
- Create at least 420,000 new employment opportunities in the agricultural value chain.
- Lift more than two million people permanently out of poverty.
- Boost annual value of farming revenues to USD 1.2 billion.
- Ensure regional food security.



#### WHAT IS THE SAGCOT CORRIDOR?

The SAGCOT Corridor is the geographic expanse in which the SAGCOT Initiative will be realized. The Corridor covers 45%¹ of Tanzania's 945,000km² agricultural land, where 75% of the Tanzania population is already engaged in the agricultural sector. The Corridor is the size of the European country, Italy.



# WHAT IS SAGCOT CENTRE LTD (SCL)?

SCL is an operational arm of the SAGCOT Initiative. The core role of the SCL is to facilitate partners to deliver an inclusive, sustainable and commercially viable agricultural value chain in the SAGCOT Corridor divided into 6 clusters; Ihemi, Mbarali, Sumbawanga, Kilombero, Ludewa and Rufiji. This visibility of, and connection to, stakeholders in the ecosystem defines the Centre's role to:

- 1 inform private and public investment about partnership opportunities as well as priority policy reforms to achieve the SAGCOT objectives;
- 2 track progress of partnerships, through monitoring and evaluation of partner commitments and progress towards their objectives;
- 3 encourage and facilitate active participation of the private sector in promoting a cohesive partnership;
- 4 promote policy and regulatory reforms necessary to achieve SAGCOT objectives;
- 5 derive lessons, adopt approaches to cluster planning and partnership facilitation, and to communicate on behalf of the SAGCOT Partnership; and
- 6 promote the SAGCOT partnership, and its opportunities, to a broader audience regionally and with international partners.



# THE PARTNERSHIP PROCESS

The SAGCOT Centre Ltd supports its partners to develop inclusive value chains. Most partners enter SAGCOT as General Partners to share information and explore partnership opportunities for investments and interventions in the Corridor. LOI Partners commit to specific investments, projects and targets by signing Letters of Intent. In addition, the SAGCOT Centre identifies five to ten strategic partnerships each year that:

- seek end-to-end value chain solutions and investments,
- convene a coalition of partners to leverage synergies,
- offer the opportunity to be scaled or replicated to maximize impact,
- provide transformative results to farmers for food security and
- improved livelihoods; and
- demonstrate positive environmental impact.
